

In the year ahead, MEDP is excited to serve the community by providing businesses the support that fosters their growth resulting Great Living- Wage Jobs in McMinnville.






OUR STRATEGIC INITIATIVES

As the McMinnville Economic Development Partnership (MEDP), we get asked to explain economic development frequently, as well as expand on what we do to help the community. Here at MEDP, we break our work into four strategic initiatives.








WORKFORCE DEVELOPMEN1

Working with our local businesses is one of the most important things we do, and it takes up the majority of our time. We help retain our local businesses to keep them in the community and help them when they are ready to expand or relocate to a new area of McMinnville. To do this, we meet with businesses frequently, working with them to help solve problems, connect them to programs and funding, and celebrate their wins.

MEDP has multiple workforce programs we use to encourage our "grow our own" workforce approach. The McMinnville WORKS internship program celebrated its 10th anniversary this past summer, and we were able to expand previous Career Bound programming thanks to a grant and support from Chemeketa Community College. We also hold monthly meetings for those interested in workforce development collaboration in McMinnville.





INNOVATION DEVELOPMEN

MEDP works with businesses looking to locate in McMinnville by helping them identify properties, find and apply for programs, and work with our community to find success in locating here.

MEDP supports our local entrepreneurs and start-up businesses with programs that provide connections and information about important resources, networking events, and long-range planning to provide more innovation opportunities in our community. We also partner to bring further innovation to McMinnville, including Launch Mid Valley, a future Center of Innovation Excellence, an Innovation hub, and more.

Cutting Edge Metal

Cutting Edge Metals, founded officially in July 2022, found space to set up operations in Bunn's Village. Our first contact with them was in October 2021. The company uses CNC Machining with a wide range of materials to create custom-cut metals and plastics for a variety of clients ranging from semiconductors to aerospace to metal cabinet doors in NFL locker rooms.

Pat Crowley, CEO of Chapul Farms, moved to McMinnville in 2019. In 2023, Chapul began collaborating with McPhillips Farm. The company is mission driven to restore biodiversity to agriculture for a more sustainable, resilient, and secure food system.. Chapul Farms is part of an emerging industry cluster of sustainability focused companies in McMinnville addressing climate impacts at the ground level.

EMPWR is located in McMinnville after acquiring Noble Foods in 2023. This year the company invested in a \$400,000 expansion and remodeled for lean processing efficiencies. With an additional line brought online, they have increased output and diversified product offerings. EMPWR intends to substantially increase its workforce by hiring more than 100 skilled employees. They are hiring to meet rapid expansion plans. EMPWR is headquartered in Belgium with factories in Croatia, Canada, and McMinnville, Oregon.

Recruitment Projects (that we can't talk about)

Plans for an innovation campus along Highway 18 made strides this year, but there's still a long way to go. In partnership with the City of McMinnville, MEDP is working to strengthen programming for entrepreneurs. The vision is to create a hub for innovation for companies in research and development, sustainability, climate and clean technology, and more, generating high-wage jobs in our community.

It can take well over 150 touchpoints (we counted) between a business reaching out and deciding to move to McMinnville.






APT's President and CEO Marcus Straw commented on the project

APT currently employs 37 individuals and will add an additional 30 with this expansion.

\$1.2 Million **Clean Room**

A small, Oregon-grown, high-tech manufacturer, APT received a \$1,200,000 Emerging Opportunity Fund Grant from Business Oregon in 2023 to expand its facility with a new cleanroom. The expansion will create a space that will enable APT to increase capacity and improve quality, with projections of adding \$8.8 million in wages, benefits, and payroll taxes into Oregon's economy by 2027. The grant was received with assistance from the MEDP office, Business Oregon, and the Oregon Manufacturing Extension Partnership

Helping local businesses is our thing



Radius Recycling

Schnitzer Steel Industries rebranded to Radius Recycling in 2023 to reflect the company's vision, purpose, and impact on the circular economy. Located in McMinnville, Radius Recycling Company focuses on recycling metal to create Green Steel, which includes reinforcing bards (rebar), coiled rebar, wire rod, merchant bar, and other specialty products. As a legacy manufacturer, Radius Recycling that also establishing itself as a part of a growing number of sustainability-focused companies in McMinnville.



At the end of 2022, Meggitt PLC became Parker Meggitt after an acquisition from Parker Aerospace Group. The acquisition has come with lean manufacturing updates in the McMinnville facility. Additionally, in 2023, we've seen many employees from the former Ultimate RB facility able to find jobs within the company. The company continues to be a leader in the aerospace industry, producing seals and components for many Boeing aircraft in the United States.

A local entrepreneur, Helen Anderson, and her company HelloCare won the 2022 Entrepreneur of the Year Award for a business in the development stage from the Oregon Entrepreneurs Network. The company, which was part of MEDP's StartUp Bootcamp in 2020, has had fast growth in the past 2 years, with an expansion from start-up to a staff of more than 80 caregivers.



Phenix Solutions

Another local start-up, Phenix Solutions, has continued growth in the past year. The company is working to create local heavy lift, remotely piloted aircraft that can be used during wildfires, for defense, and more. The company also helped support our "Grown Your Own" workforce approach this year as a part of the McMinnville WORKS program hiring a Mechanical Engineering Intern.



In 2023, ExcelTech, an Electronic Manufacturing Services (EMS) company, received \$250,000 from Business Oregon's Equipment Capital Access Program to purchase new equipment that will support the growth of the business to reach new customers. MEDP has worked with ExcelTech since 2021, providing connections to resource partners that have helped position ExcelTech to expand its reach into new markets.



In late 2022, MEDP received a Youth Development Grant from the Higher Education Coordination Commission to expand the Career Bound program. Originally piloted in 2019, the 2023 program was focused on providing essential skills training and paid work experience for priority population youth in Yamhill County. In partnership with Chemeketa Community College, the program helped 17 youth ranging from 14 to 24 with paid job training, essential skills employability classes, and eliminated barriers to employment such as clothing, technology, and transportation. Of the 17 participants, 14 of the interns were hired on with a company following completion of the program. The program will be continued with similar programming by Unidos Bridging Community, which received an Economic Equity Investment Program grant of \$400,000 to continue supporting the program.

McMinnville WORKS Celebrates 10 Years!

Ten years ago, MEDP started the McMinnville WORKS Internship Program. Designed to help the community to grow our local workforce by providing full-time, paid summer internships. Throughout this program, we have had over 1,400 applicants, over 30 host sites, and over 150 interns. Its 10th year saw the addition of 9 interns at 8 Host Sites throughout McMinnville. As always, this program would not be a success without community support, including Professional Development speakers, donations of meeting spaces, and more.

MHS and MW&L Filtration Project

Several McMinnville High School students had the opportunity to intern at McMinnville Water and Light in 2023 to custom design a prototype water filtration trailer. The trailer is designed to be deployed in an emergency where residents need access to potable water. McMinnville Water & Light plans to use the prototype design to build two more Emergency Response Drinking Water trailers

Workforce Partnership

MEDP organizes monthly meetings with community partners, businesses, and stakeholders to talk through workforce development issues impacting our community. The monthly meetings have seen up to 46 participants, with representatives from local schools, non-profits, businesses, and more. The monthly meeting provides a network for those looking to enhance and build workforce programming in the community.

SOLD CARBON



Solid Carbon has made strides in 2023 with a pilot pour of its industry-leading low-carbon concrete in McMinnville's Alpine district at Alpine Crossing and at Miller Woods. The company also received a \$242,000 High Impact Opportunity Project (HIOP) grant from Business Oregon and through the Oregon Innovation Council in late 2022 to further develop its carbonnegative solution. Partners of the grant project include MEDP, Oregon State University, Solid Carbon, Biomass One, Association of Oregon Concrete and Aggregate Producers, Northwest Cement Council, City of Portland, City of Corvallis, City of McMinnville, Wilsonville Concrete Products, Lafarge, and Euclid Chemical.

Center for Innovative Excellence

The Center of Innovation Excellence, or CiE, is a burgeoning relationship with Oregon State University to build sustainable and resilient food systems in Oregon. While this CiE was not funded, OSU was awarded a USDA Regional Food Business Hub designation to further sustainable food programs in a six-state region. The funded CiE's will be a connection for regional innovation hubs and the many innovative companies in McMinnville.



Innovative Campus

Along Three Mile Lane, on Highway 18, a 140-acre property, has been identified for a future Innovation Campus. In 2023, the City of McMinnville secured funds for a feasibility study on building out an innovation campus on this property. The community plan includes a vision for high-density, high-wage job creation with office space, research and development companies, and sites for industrial entrepreneurs and manufacturers. The campus was identified as a priority in the MAC-Town 2032 Strategic Plan and at the Economic Vitality Leadership Council.



Biz Con

The inaugural BizCon was held in late 2022 as part of MEDP's Launch Mid-Valley initiative to support local entrepreneurs and the start-up business community. This event was the inspiration of Casey Hostetler, an entrepreneur and owner of McMinnville's Alt Co-Working, who led a volunteer committee in the development of the event. Entrepreneurs had the chance to learn from state experts and local business owners about starting, managing, and growing their businesses.


